**Tuition & Fees**

This information is for engineering/computer science Master of Science programs offered by the USC Viterbi School of Engineering requiring the successful completion of a minimum of 30 units of graduate engineering coursework.

Tuition and fees for the academic year 2019-2020 are as follows:

Per Unit Graduate Engineering Tuition	\$2,075
Mandatory Fees (approximate)	\$420
Health Insurance (these are the 2018/19 costs, 2019/20 costs will be available sometime in May/June)	Fall Semester – \$730 Spring/Summer Semester – \$1,311

- Please note that tuition and fees are subject to increase each academic year.
- The typical breakdown of tuition and fees by semester on the following page is based on the academic year 2019-2020 rate. Health insurance rates are based on 2018/19 rates (2019/20 will be available in June at <http://engemannshc.usc.edu/insurance/insurance-plan>.)
- The tuition and fees rates and health insurance for academic year 2020-2021 have not been published and actual tuition, fees and health insurance rates for those semesters is expected to be higher.

Mandatory Fees	\$420
Health Insurance	\$1,311

<b>Total Cost (including health insurance)</b>	<b>\$68,067</b>

Depending on if the student requires prerequisite courses, the total number of units required may be higher.

The above are based on 2019/20 tuition and 2018/19 health insurance costs. Both of these costs change every fall, so the amounts shown are approximate.
